Riverview, New Brunswick December 12, 2016—Quality water is integral to the health and wellbeing of our communities. Improvements to the TransAqua Wastewater Treatment Facility will mean cleaner water flows into one of New Brunswick's most valued bodies of water, which is enjoyed by boaters, recreational fishers, and local residents. Preserving the Petitcodiac River will support tourism, protect public health and ensure the river remains a recreational hub for Canadians and their families for years to come.

The Honourable Ginette Petitpas Taylor, Deputy Government Whip and Member of Parliament for Moncton–Riverview–Dieppe, on behalf of the Honourable Amarjeet Sohi, Minister of Infrastructure and Communities, and the Honourable Roger Melanson, President of the Treasury Board and Minister Responsible for Trade Policy, today announced more than \$45 million in federal-provincial funding for the project.

Work involves adding a secondary level of wastewater treatment to allow the facility to meet current standards of the federal *Wastewater Systems Effluent Regulations* and reduce the amount of waste being released into regional waterways. Residents of Riverview, Moncton and Dieppe will benefit from a more reliable shared wastewater system and cleaner water in the Petitcodiac River, ensuring this natural playground can be enjoyed by residents and tourists for years to come.

The governments of Canada and New Brunswick are each contributing \$22.6 million to this project, representing 50 percent of the estimated \$90.4 million total eligible project cost. The remaining funding will be provided by TransAqua.

About TransAqua

TransAqua, the Greater Moncton Wastewater Commission (<u>www.transaqua.ca</u>) was established in 1983 to support the wastewater collection and treatment needs of the Dieppe, Moncton and Riverview tri-community. Since then, it has developed a 31kilometre collection network and a treatment facility to best deliver on this mandate. It has also become a leader in the reuse of bio-solids through the generation of type 'AA' compost (the highest grade currently achieved in Canada) as opposed to disposal in a landfill site. The organization is now positioning itself to further upgrade its facilities to







provide an enhanced secondary treatment approach that will allow it to meet recently introduced mandatory federal regulations prior to the 2020 deadline.
