## Upgrade and Modernization Project Update

The WWTF Upgrade and Modernization Project is well underway. The Administration Building is expected to be substantially completed in early March. The base slab for Clarifier 1 and 2 are now complete along with the center gallery. Excavation and backfill for the base of tank 4 is also complete and formwork installed. The walls and roof slab of the new Primary Gallery are complete. The base of the grit tanks has been completed and the forms installed for the walls. The sub-structure, block walls and roofing membrane of the Septage Receiving Building are complete.

## 2017 Compost Program a Success!

TransAqua reintroduced 7,400 tonnes of compost back into the Greater Moncton Community for ratepayers gardening and landscaping projects. We are pleased to provide compost as part of our commitment to the community towards environmental sustainability.

## TransAqua freezes the rate for 2018!

The same rate of \$210 per residential unit was approved for 2018. This wastewater treatment rate has been the same since 2016 when the federal and provincial governments provided infrastructure funding for the WWTF Upgrade and Modernization Project. Ratepayers have seen their rates increase by an average of \$7.69/year since 2005.

## Lead Operator Peter Brown – Industry Awards Winner!

Peter Brown has been awarded the Water Environment Federation's (WEF) 2017 Morgan Operational Solutions Award and the 2017 ACWWA Silent Hero Award for his innovative approach to visually inspecting large diameter sewer pipes. TransAqua's 5'6" diameter, 1.1km tunnel transporting wastewater from Moncton and Dieppe to the treatment facility in Riverview was inspected in 2016 and found to be structurally sound.
