The Grit Classifier and conveyor have been commissioned. The Primary Clarifiers are expected to be commissioned by the end of October. Design work is proceeding on the Bioreactor and construction for Sludge Handling and the 4<sup>th</sup> clarifier has begun. wipes are not
really
flushable and
destroy
wastewater
equipment

TransAqua's wastewater system consists of collection sewer pipe, wastewater pumping stations and major equipment throughout the wastewater treatment facility that can be damaged when flushable wipes are flushed down the toilet! "Flushable wipes" are advertised as "just like toilet paper" however disintegrate in the sewer system. "Flushable" wipes, baby cleaning wipes or wipes that are not biodegradable do not break down and can block your sewer lateral to the street and TransAqua's sewer pipes leading to a costly repair bill. Toilets are to used only for the 3P's (pee, poo and paper (toilet paper only). The International Water Industry, including the Canadian Water and Wastewater Association is advocating government industry to implement requirements for 'flushable wipes" to clearly labelled "Do not flush" and direct customers to dispose of them in the garbage can. "Flushable" wipes get wrapped around expensive pump impellors causing premature failure resulting in higher rates for pump repairs and/or replacement and maintaining blocked sewer pipes.
